In 2019, he was honored to be featured in the "Signature Series" with the CSPO in the role of artistic director and soloist. Sergei has held principal clarinet positions with Des Moines Metro Opera Orchestra and Boise Philharmonic. He is on faculty at

University of Colorado - CS and Colorado State University. He holds degrees and awards from the University of Michigan, Rice University, and the University of Southern California.
