This is a truly special Season Finale! Here are a few words written about the Mozart Wind Quintet:

"The best thing I have ever written," is how Mozart exuberantly characterized his E-flat Quintet, K. 452, to his father Leopold, a few days after its premiere on April 1, 1784, in Vienna's Burgtheater. "How I wish you could have heard it, and how beautifully it was performed! The audience was enthusiastic." We might question the composer's evaluation of this ingratiating charmer, but

another vote of confidence came from no less than Ludwig van Beethoven, who modeled his own Op. 16 Quintet upon the work in 1797." - John Henken.

It is only natural to pair the Mozart with one of his devoted 20th century followers - Francis Poulenc. "Poulenc wrote the Sextet for Piano and Winds as "an homage to the wind instruments I have loved from the moment I began composing." It's an ingeniously constructed work that is filled with jaunty tunes and bouncy intertwining rhythms. It's not all surface ease and lightness, though. The rapid exchange of short melodic phrases rests on a complex structure, and there are constant abrupt shifts in mood, from humor to more weighty emotions." - Barbara Leish

**Joshua Elmore** is Principal Bassoonist of the Fort Worth Symphony. His many performances include the NY Philharmonic and the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra. He studied at the Colburn School in LA and Juilliard. He has also performed on NPR's *From The Top* and is a recipient of the Jack Kent Cooke Young Artist Award.



**Elizabeth Gray** is Acting Associate Principal Horn of the Kansas City Symphony and was previously with the Houston Symphony. She graduated magna cum laude from Rice. She has played in the Colorado Music Festival and is a sought after educator. She has taught at Interlochen and her students have gone on to major arts conservatories and university programs.



**Noah Kay** our former Principal Oboe of the Colorado Springs Philharmonic is a DMA candidate at Stony Brook University. He recently joined the Chatauqua Institution Symphony and is principal oboe of *Symphony in C* in Camden, NJ. He has toured Europe and the US with the Orpheus Chamber Orchestra, including a Deutsche Gramophone recording and performances at Carnegie Hall.



Atlanta-based flutist **Jessica Petrasek** has been the Principal Flutist of the Knoxville and Wichita Symphonies and has played with the Sarasota Opera Orchestra, and the Kansas City Symphony. She met her husband Joe, principal percussionist of the Atlanta Symphony, when they played at Tanglewood together. She is the flute professor at GA State University.



Pianist Andrew Staupe has appeared as soloist with many of the top orchestras throughout the US and Europe. He is Assistant Professor of Piano at the University of Houston and Artistic Director of the Young Artist World Piano Festival in Minnesota. He has jammed with legendary vocalist Bobby McFerrin and played Tangos with the Assad Brothers. His debut CD with violinist Hasse Borup is on the Naxos label.



**Sergei Vassiliev** is Principal Clarinet of the Colorado Springs Philharmonic and Artistic Director of EPIC. Sergei has appeared in the US and Europe as a soloist, chamber musician, and clinician. Sergei has held principal clarinet positions with Des Moines Metro Opera Orchestra and Boise Philharmonic.
